





THE BLUE AND JOHN CROW MOUNTAINS

Jamaica's First World Heritage Site

The Blue and John Crow Mountains World Heritage Site is a mixed site having outstanding natural and cultural significance. The property spans 3 parishes: St. Thomas, Portland and St. Andrew.

The site was inscribed a World Heritage Site July 3, 2015. World Heritage is our legacy from the past which we live with todayand what we pass on to future generations.

Holywell located in the Blue and John Crow Mountains

A World Heritage Site can be described as any natural or man-made site, area or structure. It can only be placed on the World Heritage List as a World Heritage Site after the country in which the site is located has nominated it as a Heritage Site and has proven to the World Heritage Committee that this site is of outstanding value and uniqueness. The Blue and John Crow Mountains is included among other great sites such as Old Havana in Cuba, the Great Wall of China and the Pyramids of Egypt.



The natural significance of the Blue and John Crow Mountains heritage site refers to the Flora and Fauna that are found within the site, some of which are endemic to Jamaica.

What is the meaning of Endemic?

The term endemic refers to species that are restricted in their natural distribution to a particular locality.

E.g. The Giant Swallowtail butterfly is endemic to the island of Jamaica, which means it is only found in Jamaica living naturally in the wild.

In the Blue and John Crow Mountains:

Endemic Plants: Water Mahoe, Broad Thatch and Jamaican Rose Endemic Animals: Jamaican Coney, Giant Swallowtail Butterfly and the Yellow Snake

The cultural significance of the heritage site refers to the history and heritage of the Windward Maroons - descendants of Africans who fought and escaped from slavery and established communities in the mountainous interior regions of Jamaica.

The leader of the Windward Maroons is Nanny or Queen Nanny.



The Spooky Nature of Psychology?

Most Jamaican people are a little spooked by the word psychologist, or therapist and maybe less so by counsellor. I wanted to spend a little time in this piece talking about what psychology really is about and help others to see it from a different perspective, one that maybe is not so threatening.

We all employ psychological principles when we think about how to discipline our children, how to make our relationships work better, how to feel better, how to deal with stress, how to deal with death, how to deal with the loss of a relationship, how to achieve better grades, what careers to choose, how to improve our self-esteem, and with any of these issues, a psychologist can be very helpful in guiding someone as to how to get through the process more effectively.

Psychology is the study of behaviour and the mind and is not only about "madness" (here people are usually referring to Schizophrenia or Bipolar Disorder or other psychotic process, which encompass about 3% of all psychological disorders, but I will discuss that in another issue), but there's also anxiety, trauma-related stressors, personality disorders, depression, developmental disorders, neurocognitive disorders and the list goes on.


